We would like to pay tribute to him for his outstanding service to the Parish, his professionalism and sound advice has been vital to Parish Councillors over the many years and we offer him all our good wishes in his well earnt retirement.

We welcome Julie James as our new Clerk who is very appreciative, as are we for the thorough and smooth handover from Chris and we all look forward to working with Julie as she settles into her post with us.

Staying with our staff I am sure you will agree that Shaun Singleton and Ray Bolton work hard keeping the village neat and tidy with their work maintaining woodland footpaths, cutting back overgrown shrubs and hedges and general tidiness across our village. We are grateful to Rotherham MBC for funding towards our footpath officer which allows us to continue this work. Our caretaker Karen Haycox manages the few lettings we now have and ensures the Reading Room stays clean and tidy.

We are pleased to welcome three new Parish Councillors: Les Pickford, Eve Levin and Shaun McKie all having been co-opted onto the Parish Council to fill vacancies. I am sure they look forward to the rewards and challenges of, as your representatives looking after our village.

In other news I am pleased to be able to tell that you we have had the toilet facilities in the Reading Room refurbished, completion has been delayed by the virus but this should be all done by the time you read this newsletter with just a little decorating still to do.

Fly-tipping remains an ongoing issue however on a positive note I can report that summons have been issued where it can be identified who is responsible and that Rotherham Borough Council have been active with the Parish Council in requiring those littering to clean up.

Another issue we know is of concern is the antisocial off-roading that takes place at the back of Mill Lane damaging the landscape and presenting a risk to other users. Information including photographs has been passed to the Police and we are in contact with Rotherham MBC regarding options to block unauthorised vehicular access. Similarly the Police have been involved in addressing gatherings and the irresponsible behaviour particularly of young people around Treeton Dyke. Everyone is reminded that such gatherings are illegal during the Coronavirus lockdown and reminded of the importance of adhering to social distancing for the benefit of everyone not least your own family and loved ones.

The Parish Council continues both direct and indirect financial support for activities in the village for example fireworks last bonfire night, small grants to the Royal British Legion, Rotherham Holiday Aid and Rotherham's Mayor charity. We continue to fund the youth club held in the community centre which prior to its suspension due to the Coronavirus was going from strength to strength, I am sure it will return with enthusiasm when restrictions are lifted.



We need your help to look after our village and so a plea to everyone:

Horse riding on Well Lane - this is not common land it is owned by Rotherham Borough Council and horse riding is prohibited through byelaw. Whilst it can be pleasing to residents of the village to see horse and rider, the Parish Council and residents are bound by these byelaws and as such respectfully remind horse riders to only use the designated bridle paths please.

4x4 vehicles on Mill Lane playing field - the Parish Council assumes the drivers are aware this is not permitted and ask in the interests of public safety and to avoid damage to the landscape that they do not off road on the field.

Litter - because of the Coronavirus restrictions we have both reduced staffing resources and are unable to organise litter picks so a plea to take your litter home with you.


