Chairman's Annual Review

This is a very sobering Annual Report to write as this last year has presented such a challenge to us all as individuals, to our community, our town, the country and indeed worldwide. There can be no-one left untouched by the personal and economic havoc that the virus which landed on our shores just over a year ago has brought upon us all and which sadly continues.

In Treeton there has been personal impact on our residents in many ways including the loss of loved ones and my thoughts are with you all. Also, my thanks go to you, our local community for the way in which you have supported vulnerable friends and neighbours and to Treeton Grange Nursing Home for its care of our elderly residents in such challenging circumstances.

Many of our working age residents will have felt the impact too. My gratitude and admiration to all our key workers who have worked through these challenging times be you; front line NHS/care services, a teacher, delivery person, retail assistant and whilst furlough has given financial support to many unable to work, there have been gaps and that has brought hardship too.

The Parish Council paused all but its business activity last March and closed our Reading Room, and the youth club. We were able to restart our work in the village as summer arrived and have continued with COVID protection for our team in place to be able to do so, but sadly the youth club has been stop start and the Reading Room still remains closed.

We are now looking forward to summer. We have the vaccines, and there is much to hope and look forward to in 2021. Some restrictions will remain for a considerable time, but with care, and following health guidance, I really do feel we are winning against this virus.

Across the village Rotherham Borough Council has completed road surfacing works and continues to support our work through the Public Rights of Way Partnership Scheme providing funding towards our maintenance work of the village pathways.

Sadly, we continue with the challenge of litter, flytipping and anti-social off roading. We are very grateful to our growing team of litter pickers; you make a real difference to our village and continue to work with the Borough Council and the police to address the other issues.

We were pleased to support the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal this year and as we look forward, our youth club has just restarted. We are grateful for support given to the Community Centre to allow the creation of outdoor space, which we hope will mean the youth club, led on our behalf by SJD Sports will be able to remain open for the benefit of all our young people.

Finally, I would like to give my appreciation to Shaun Singleton and Ray Bolton for the work that they do in keeping the village looking well and the pathways clear and to Karen Haycox for her work in ensuring the Reading Room is clean and in good condition for when we can re-open.



Treeton Medical Centre News

At Treeton Medical Centre we are experiencing high demands for our appointments and services. We are sure when some of you have been trying to contact the surgery and book appointments that the phone lines are very busy.

We are often having to overbook our surgeries, and especially by the afternoon we have almost no capacity left to fit in more telephone calls or appointments. There are multiple reasons for this, but one is that new housing developments in Waverley, Catcliffe and soon Treeton being built mean we are registering large numbers of new patients.

Our small building means that although we have increased our staffing levels we have almost run out of room. Also restrictions with social distancing have also had an impact on the amount of patients we are able to safely see face to face and additional time for appointments required.

A new medical centre for Waverley is currently going through the planning process and with no delays should be opening in October 2022. This means that further patients moving into the area before then may choose to register with us and numbers will continue to increase for a time.

During the next 18 months we will try our hardest to maintain our service for all patients and are looking at ways we can be innovative and use what space we have in the best way.

There are some services that may be alternatives to a GP or Nurse Practitioner appointment, some are longstanding and some new. Please consider them and our reception staff may suggest self referral to eg Physiotherapy or Talking Sense.

After 2pm if our service is becoming overwhelmed we may have to direct reception to advise you attend the walk in centre or contact us the following morning.

Bloods results – Please contact the surgery between 11am and 2pm for your results to help patients needing to access on the day appointments.

Routine Referrals to hospital – We have no control over appointment waiting times you will need to use the contact details provide to chase up any outstanding appointments. If you are awaiting an urgent appointment and have not heard within 2wks please contact the secretary.

Covid-19 pandemic - Due to the pandemic the majority of GP appointments will still be conducted over the telephone or video consultation. We are now beginning to increase our face to face appointment for nursing staff to ensure patients who need to be seen are seen. Please do not attend surgery unless you have been advised to do so. Do not attend the surgery if you

suspect you have Covid or isolating due to a family member unless advised to do so.

If you are advised to attend surgery for a face to face appointment we advise you attend with your own face covering. Please do not attend to surgery more than 5 minutes prior to your appointment time due to limited waiting area. You may be ask to wait outside if maximum number of patients is reached within the waiting area.

Repeat Prescription requests: We are encouraging patients to sign up online via the Rotherham Health App so that these can be completed electronically. https://rotherhamhealthapp.com/splash If you still have paper prescriptions, please write your nominated pharmacy and your up to date contact details on the request. **All new requests will only be sent directly to the pharmacy**.

Update contact details - Please update your contact details if they have changed, this will enable the practice to contact you for routine or urgent matters.

If you have a mobile phone could you please let the surgery know, this will enable the practice the facility to be able to send an appointment text reminder to you.

Remembering Pilot Officer Douglas Gibson Edwards

The Parish Council are really pleased to have been able to finally replace the stolen plaque commemorating this brave pilot. It is now back in the stone at the top of Edwards Meteor Way, over-looking the village.



Pilot Officer Edwards was on a training mission on 21st December 1954 in a Gloster Meteor aircraft when he flew out of cloud and into the ground. Thankfully he avoided the village but crashed into the hillside near Treeton Colliery, his aircraft exploding on impact.



Douglas was found 150 yards away from his stricken aircraft and is now buried in Retford Road Cemetery at Worksop.

Burial Ground

Memorial Headstones

The safety checks on the headstones in our burial ground have now been completed and sadly a number of memorials have needed to be laid flat to ensure they don't topple onto anyone and cause injury. Notices have been put on the memorials we have needed to lay flat for safety, and our Clerk continues to try and make contact with families. Anyone with any concerns should please phone her on 01226 744910 or email treetonpc@aol.com. She will be happy to help.

You must not attempt a repair a laid memorial yourself or just push your family headstone back upright. The average memorial stone weighs around 220 kg or twice an average adult. Imagine that falling on perhaps a member of your family as they tend the grave. We do not want to have to remove any to safe keeping to prevent them falling should those we have needed to lay flat continue to be pushed back into an unsafe upright position.

The safety check identified a number of memorials that whilst currently safe, do need some remedial work to ensure they remain so. The work required ranges from some memorials whilst safe, are loose in their fixings. Others require securing more firmly back to their base and others re-cementing. Over the coming weeks, a notice will be placed on these memorials asking families to get in touch so we can tell you what work is needed to ensure your memorial doesn't fail our next safety check. If you have any questions please do get in touch with our Clerk.

We understand this is sensitive work. Our aim is to ensure the safety of the burial ground for everyone while they tend graves, reflect & pay respects to their loved ones.

Landscaping work

You may have noticed work on the strip of ground by the notice board and waste bins. We are getting new larger bins, moving them into the corner by the entrance so the area looks tidier and putting down grass, creating further space for burial plots for ashes of loved ones and to generally make that area look tidier and more restful.

Hopefully you've spotted our new 'Welcome to Treeton' signage and the celebration of our mining heritage at the top of Bole Hill and bottom of Mill Lane. We are now planning for the return of these important symbols of our heritage back to Wood Lane

Now work on the entrance road into the Jones Homes estate is nearing completion, we are in touch with them & Rotherham Borough Council's Planning Department to ensure the wheel and mine tubs are re-installed as soon as possible. They will be located on the inward side of the carriageway of Wood Lane and we want to ensure they are located properly and clearly visible as a proper welcome to our village and reminder of Treeton's proud mining history.
