

Treeton Medical Centre News

Dear Patients

Many thanks from all the staff at Treeton Medical Centre for your continued support over the last year. We have strived to provide medical care under the COVID pressures and are very grateful to you all for accepting all the changes brought in by the NHS in accessing our services - especially the wearing of PPE in our clinics.

Over the last year we have been involved in the COVID vaccination programme - our practice manager, nursing & admin teams have been working in the clinics 7 days a week. Alongside other practices we have vaccinated 100,987 patients across Rotherham with both doses already, which is a great achievement. You may have noticed that we have also brought in video calls and care navigation pathways (direct access to other clinicians such as podiatrists and counselling). These new approaches to healthcare have had positive reviews from patients and we will continue to offer them in the longer term. See our website or social media for more information.

However, alongside COVID there has been an added demand on our services. The new housing developments have increased our list size from 6700 to 7300 in the last year. Whilst we have endeavoured to increase the number of clinic appointments these are limited by the restraints of our small clinic building and we are aware that it is becoming increasingly difficult to get in touch with us. There are plans to build a new surgery on the Waverley estate which will provide much needed primary care services. We are pushing for this to be built as soon as possible and have recently spoken to the local MP about this matter.




Litter Pickers

We plan to start at the centre of Treeton from St Helen's and work our way out towards the boundary to Wood Lane burial ground, to the bottom of Mill Lane and Bole Hill bus turn to start with before moving into through roads within the village.

You can help us by tidying your hedge and shrubs where they overhang the pavement because we cannot cut those back as they are your property and your responsibility. It would be really appreciated if you gave them a trim.

The Military Community Veterans Centre (MCVC) based in Rotherham is embarking on a new project called HIDDEN FACES to reach out to veterans in all areas of Rotherham to help combat loneliness and promote camaraderie.

HIDDEN FACES PROJECT has a simple aim. Help Veterans to help Veterans find a place to belong.

Their first challenge is to identify vulnerable veterans, lonely people rarely wear a placard shouting about their feelings and the second is when identified lonely veterans struggle to engage with others. Rotherham MCVC will provide the opportunities to bring veterans together in friendly and welcoming settings, encouraging participation with no expectations.

Worldwide the military have an unwritten faithfulness to each other, fill a room with 100 servicemen of any service & any nation and very quickly there will be unprompted conversations & laughter coming from a group of strangers. There is a loyalty to each other that seldom exists elsewhere.

Rotherham MCVC is wanting to promote their aims so everyone in the region knows of them and their goals and follow up with events and activities to develop bonds and friendships with other attending veterans.

They are asking friends, family & neighbours to consider referring anyone that they are worried about to Rotherham MCVC so they in turn can offer support.

Support might range from day trips to the seaside for fish and chips, days out to local attractions, online quizzes, simple chats or presentations. The priority is not the event but the shared memory it creates, the growing sense of belonging to a new but widening community and a potential desire to in turn help others.

Rotherham MCVC is a route to a settled life in Rotherham following military service.


