Chairman's Annual Report

This is a much more cheerful Annual Report than I wrote last year. Whilst COVID has undoubtedly impacted all of our lives I think we can be reasonably confident that the worst is over and we are now able to look forward to much more normality in our lives.

The Parish Council has been busy over this last year with improvements in the burial ground to tidy up the entrance and an audit of waste bins as the basis of some work with RMBC to get new bins sighted at hotspots, missing ones replaced and some with little use relocated to where they will have greatest impact. We have extended our summer planting and introduced flower holsters on the lamp posts across the village.

Our staff team has been reduced to reflect much less use of the Reading Room and we have been pleased to put those savings towards the Christmas lights and trees that brought seasonal cheer through December and daffodil bulbs planted by volunteers to continue that cheer into spring.

Fortnightly drop-ins restarted in the autumn in the Reading Room initially with Parish Councillor and Housing Champion surgeries but more recently joined by Police Community Support Officers and together I feel we are making a real difference and helping to answer some of your queries and addressing your concerns around antisocial behaviour.

We continue to work in partnership with Rotherham Borough Council and together have jointly funded 2 projects this year, one to replace the damaged zip wire with new swings and to install a seat in Well Lane play park and the second to erect barriers and a gate at the back of Mill Lane to prevent access and nuisance from antisocial off roading close to residents' homes in that area. The Borough Council has also continued to support our work through the Public Rights of Way Partnership Scheme providing some funding towards our maintenance of public rights of way and other 'green' routes across Treeton.

Our youth club restarted in September led on our behalf by SJD Sports and hosted at the Community Centre, slowly at first but now back in full swing and being enjoyed by children and young people from within the village and beyond.

Sadly, we continue with the challenge of antisocial behaviour with off roading, litter and fly tipping, we are very grateful to our expanding team of very conscientious litter pickers; you make a real difference to our village.

Finally, I would like to give my appreciation to Shaun Singleton for the work that he does in keeping the village pathways and pavements clear, planting, tidying and so much more, including moving mountains of autumn leaves which really does make a difference.





Dear Patients

Covid Updates - masks are still required when entering the surgery, this is to protect our staff and patients. A range of appointments are available, including telephone, video and face to face. Sicknote requests due to Covid will only be done after the initial self certification period and you have reported your positive test result with the NHS track and trace.

Booking Online Appointments

Please ensure you book into the correct slot type:

<u>TELEPHONE & FACE TO FACE APPOINTMENTS</u> - Please ensure you have booked in appropriately. You must wear a face covering for all face to face appointments. For telephone consultations please ensure you are available within 30mins before and after your appointment time as we cannot guarantee you will be contacted at exactly this time due to delays.

<u>SMEAR APPOINTMENTS</u> (nurse clinic)- only book if you have received an invite from the surgery or from cervical screening. If you are not due for a smear this will discarded by the laboratory.

<u>ADVANCE NURSE PRACTITIONER</u> - The advanced nurse practitioner can deal with headaches, chest infections, sore throat, sinusitis, diarrhoea, abdominal pain, heartburn, sickness, UTI, thrush, gout, new neck or back problems, acne, eczema, rashes, warts, verrucae, impetigo, bites, ingrowing toenails, allergic reactions, hay fever, asthma attacks, medication reviews. The appointments are not appropriate for pregnant ladies or mental health issues. We have both female and male ANP's please do not book with Richard Sharp for female problems. Breast lumps will need to be booked in with a GP

PHARMACY APPOINTMENTS – Theses appointments are only for medication reviews.

Travel Vaccination

Now travel restrictions are being lifted and we begin to travel abroad again patients should ensure they are up to date with travel vaccinations. Patients should book at least 6-8wks prior to travel, this will allow time to build up immunity. You will require a 20min appointment followed by an additional 10 mins for each traveller. Celebrating the Jubilee - Street Parties





Our nation has a long history of organising street parties to celebrate national events and we are all being encouraged to do so again with our neighbours for the Platinum Jubilee.

We are all hoping for good June weather and to help street parties in Treeton into full swing over the long weekend bank holiday the Parish Council has 'goodie bags' of bunting and flags to help you trim up for your party.



Please come along to pick one up, there is one for each street in Treeton and some spares for the longer roads.

You can contact any of our Parish Councillors to make arrangements or call into the Reading Room or Community Centre.



When planning your street parties it is important you think about road safety and access and whilst your party may be best in a closed road so more people can join in and there is no traffic for the day you may not be able to, want to or have time to arrange a road closure.

If you do wish to apply for a road closure you do so by email to either: aimee.baker@rotherham.gov.uk or streetworksenforcement@rotherham.gov.uk and you will be sent further information and a form to complete. Your completed form should be returned to either of these email address by 20th May. RMBC are being very supportive of our wish to celebrate, there is no charge to apply and provided the road you are seeking to close is not a main road and would not impact a key route they are likely to agree.

If you don't wish to apply to close the road you can still have an informal 'street meet'; pick a practical spot in the street to have a get together maybe on a driveway, in a parking area, front garden or end of a cul-de-sac, perhaps use the pavement and

put bunting between your cars to make a party space. The key thing is to make sure children are safely away from any vehicles and that residents are happy with the arrangements. Please remember you must not obstruct other pedestrians, have people wandering into the road unsafely and must allow vehicles to be able to get in and out.

Celebrating the Jubilee - Baking Competition

The Nation's cooks and bakers have once again been challenged to make a 'pudding fit for the Queen' for her 70th Anniversary celebrations. The British pudding comes in all shapes and sizes: steamed or baked, layered or rolled, a pie or crumble, a cake or tart. Fortnum & Masons may be organising the national Pudding Competition here in Treeton we have our own Treeton Bake off.

The gauntlet has been put down by Beryl Nuttall and Cllr Victoria Beckett to all residents in Treeton, both young and old to enter. There is a short entry form, which you can get by contacting Victoria to be completed and returned to the Reading Room by Wednesday 18th May.

Hopefully the pastry chefs amongst our residents have seen the posters and will be busy baking ready for judging on Saturday 4th June 12.00noon at the Miner's Welfare.

The challenges are for adults:

To create either the perfect 8" Victoria Sponge Cake using these ingredients:

8oz self-raising flour 8oz caster sugar 8oz margarine

4 large eggs

Filled with home made butter cream, strawberry jam with Icing sugar to dust

Any homemade & decorated cake fit for The Queen's Jubilee Afternoon Tea

For children the challenge is:

3 home made cup cakes set on a tea plate decorated in a royal theme

A 6" round home made cookie set on a base and decorated in a royal theme



In 1953 Poulet Reine Elizabeth was created to celebrate the Coronation of HM The Queen. It's more popularly known as Coronation chicken. This is the original recipe for a dish 'fit for a Queen'

Ingredients

2.3kg (5lb) chicken 100ml red wine 1 tbsp vegetable oil 1 small, finely chopped onion 1 tbsp curry paste 1 bay leaf 1 tbsp tomato puree 1/2 lemon juice salt and pepper

4 finely chopped apricot halves 300ml (1/2 pint) mayonnaise

100ml (4 fl oz) whipping cream watercress to garnish

Recipe

- 1. Skin the chicken and cut into small pieces and grill it until cooked.
- 2. In a small saucepan, heat the oil, add the onion & cook for about three minutes; until softened.
- 3. Add the curry paste, tomato puree, wine, bay leaf and lemon juice.
- 4. Simmer, uncovered for about 10 minutes until well reduced.
- 5. Strain and leave to cool.
- 6. Puree the chopped apricot halves in a blender or food processor or through a sieve.
- 7. Beat the cooled sauce into the mayonnaise with the apricot puree.
- 8. Whip the cream to stiff peaks and fold into the mixture.
- 9. Season, adding a little extra lemon juice if necessary.
- 10. Fold in the chicken pieces, garnish with watercress and serve
