## War Memorial Project

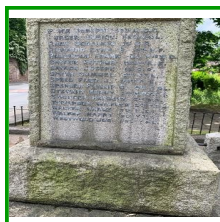
We are really pleased with the progress on our war memorial project. You will have seen during October a huge amount of work has taken place. We had tree surgeons on site to work carefully on the overcrowded trees and shrubs. They have cut back and removed overgrown vegetation alongside removing bags and bags of accumulated dead green waste plus a builders rubble bag full of plastic waste.



At the beginning of November specialist restoration stonemasons gave the memorial a good clean removing decades of weathering and lichen giving it a much brighter appearance.

They have also cleaned and repaired the commemorative lettering replacing those that have been lost.

We were really pleased to have completed this work in time for Remembrance Day.



Our next piece of work will be to undertake more tidying up of the vegetation, in particular the ivy to the side and rear with the aim of getting the ground in a good condition to lawn next year so the site looks well but is low maintenance. There are badly overgrown flower beds that may give us opportunity for spring planting.



We also want to look at what we can do with the paved area to make best use of the lovely York Stone flags we have there and to provide a base for some seating. If you have any suggestions please do let Wendy know, her phone number is 07973 310680.





**Where do I report it?****Who can help me?**

With so many public bodies involved in the provision of services we thought a list of who does what and contact information might be helpful and so have pulled together a list of these that you can cut out of the newsletter and save for easy reference.

**Treeton Parish Council** is responsible for Wood Lane burial ground, the cowfield and the war memorial garden. We provide improvements such as the flower holsters, Christmas lights and support for adhoc events. Alongside this we work on behalf of, and with residents to address concerns about services carried out by other public bodies such as Rotherham Borough Council, Yorkshire Water, South Yorkshire Transport. **You can contact any of your Parish Councillors or our Clerk for help.**

**Rotherham Borough Council** is responsible for all highway matters, street lighting and street cleaning, problems with overhanging hedges, fly tipping, domestic and street waste collection. The play park on Well Lane plus the fields and woods at the back of Mill Lane. They also deal with council housing and can help with problems with private landlords, they are your contact for libraries, social services and some aspects of education. Most of the public services across the Borough are delivered or managed by them.

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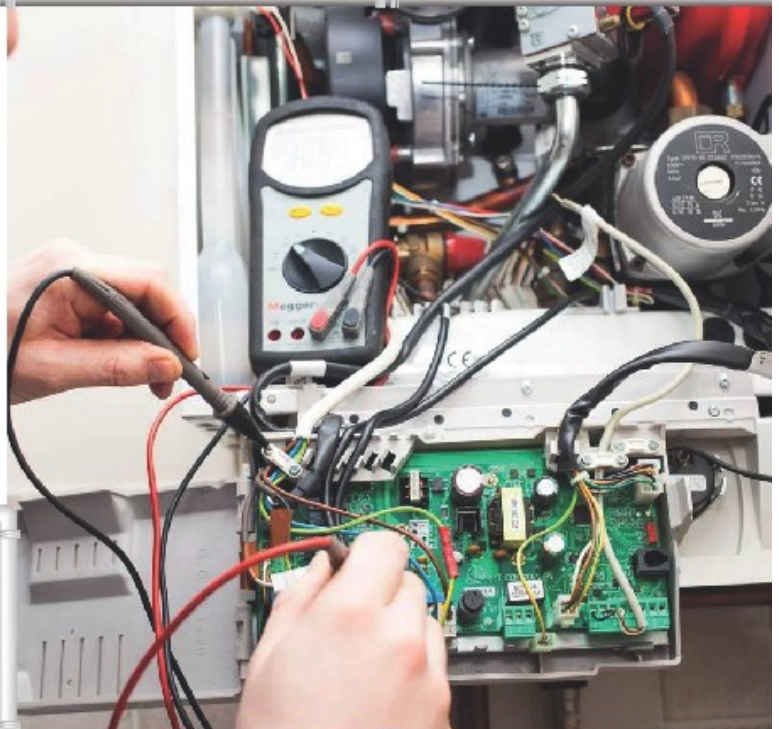

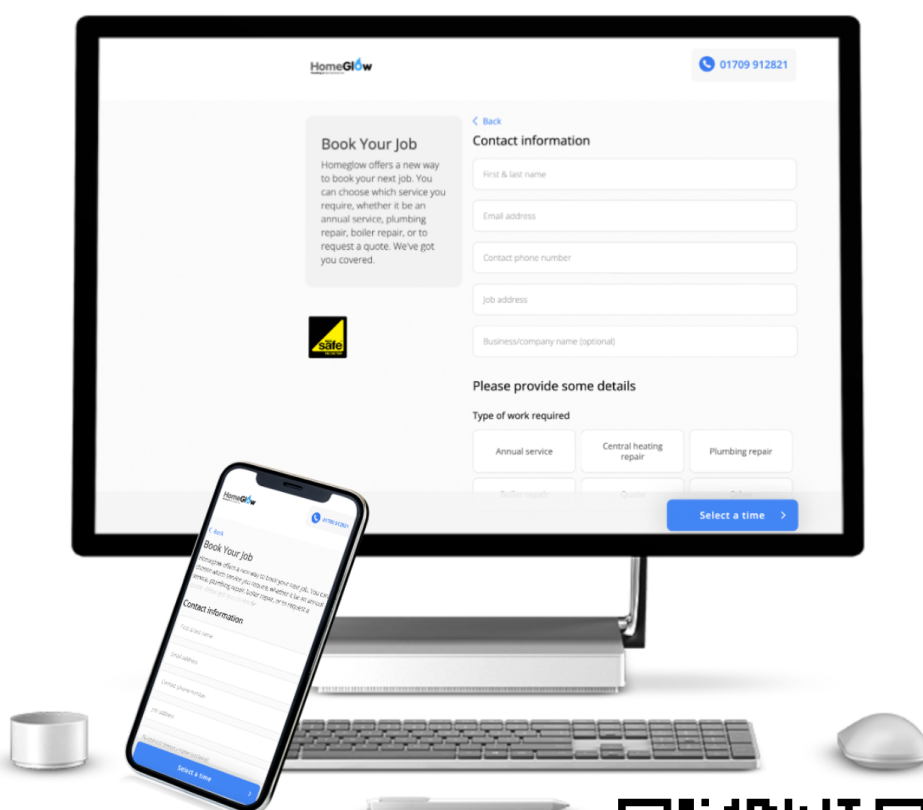

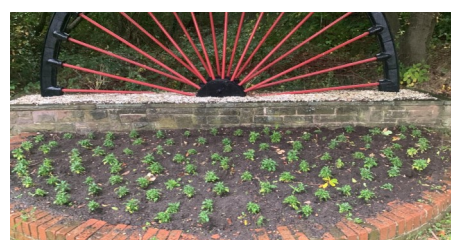

### Booking Online Appointments

Please ensure you book into the correct slot type:

**SMEAR APPOINTMENTS** (nurse clinic)- only book if you have received an invite from the surgery or from cervical screening. If you are not due for a smear this will be discarded by the laboratory.

**TELEPHONE & FACE TO FACE APPOINTMENTS** - Please ensure you have booked in appropriately. You must wear a face covering for all face to face appointments. For telephone consultations please ensure you are available within 30mins before and after your appointment time as we cannot guarantee you will be contacted at exactly this time due to delays.

**ADVANCE NURSE PRACTITIONER** - The advanced nurse practitioner can deal with headaches, chest infections, sore throat, sinusitis, diarrhoea, abdominal pain, heartburn, sickness, UTI, thrush, gout, new neck or back problems, acne, eczema, rashes, warts, verrucae, impetigo, bites, ingrowing toenails, allergic reactions, hay fever, asthma attacks, medication reviews. The appointments are not appropriate for pregnant ladies or mental health issues. We have both female and male ANP's please do not book with Richard Sharp for female problems. Breast lumps will need to be booked in with a GP

**ROTHERHAM HUB SERVICES** include Physio appointments, Advanced Nurse Practitioner & GP telephone Bookable through Rotherham Health APP. Self-referrals to Ear Care, Continence and Mental Health Services

**MENTAL HEALTH PRACTITIONER** – We now have a practitioner who can help with your mental health needs. These appointments are available to book via the surgery

**ONLINE ACCESS** - Did you know you can order your repeat medication online, book appointments and view your test results? Download the NHS app to access your records.

## Burial Ground Project



You will have noticed over the summer some real improvements in the grounds maintenance of our burial ground in large part due to our new contractor who works hard to keep the grass and shrubs tidy, bins emptied and from who over the autumn we contracted some extra work to undertake a number of specific task to address some longstanding concerns.

We have invested in a tidy compound to keep boards, soil and other 'business items' out of site and are now turning to the footpaths some of which are in a very poor state of repair. We have experienced a problem with the gate post and wall at the entrance to the burial ground which was being pushed forward by the tree at the rear and sadly we have had to remove it to prevent further and more significant damage.

**Please look out for the signs at the entrance to the burial ground for an update on work on the paths planned to take place mid January which for the health and safety of both workmen and visitors will require access to some areas of the burial ground to be restricted.**

Alongside these improvement works; the guidelines and regulations relating to the burial ground have been amended to provide for the more effective management of burials, memorials and surrounding memorabilia. The revised rules are intended to help us maintain the burial ground to a high standard and ensure that items are contained within the curtilage of burial plots and do not interfere with on-going maintenance work such as grass cutting or represent a health and safety risk arising from broken glass, pottery and brittle plastic items around graves and in the bins.

With this in mind we have provided a new bin for all such items. There should be no glass items at all in the burial ground to prevent cut injuries to our team, contractors and importantly you our visiting families but we do appreciate occasionally there may be temporarily a pottery item or that plastic items are made brittle by the sun and so ask that as you tidy and maintain graves **please remove anything you consider may cause a cut injury into the new bin. Please do not add it to the flower bins which are sorted by hand for composting.**

These new guidelines will form part of an agreement between ourselves and families for all new interments including those into existing plots and we plan to work with all families in the first instance to address reducing memorabilia which extends outside grave plots and items that are breakable and risk cut injuries. We realise this is a very sensitive matter and do hope you appreciate our reasons and will work with us to achieve a good outcome for everyone in a space that we know is so important to you.

## Burial Ground Project

### Extract from guidelines and regulations

#### Ongoing Care and Maintenance of the Burial Ground, Graves and Memorials

The Parish Council is responsible for the upkeep of the lawns, paths, hedges and trees including the turf over the burial plots i.e., the grave surface.

Whilst all reasonable care will be taken in the maintenance of the burial ground the Parish Council cannot be held responsible for any damage or injury whatsoever to or caused by any memorial or associated ornamentation.

No responsibility is accepted by contractors to the Parish Council for damage to any item on a grave other than the approved memorial.

The maintenance of memorial is the responsibility of the grave owner or family of the deceased

The Parish Council reserves the right to make safe any memorial which becomes unsafe or falls in to disrepair by laying it flat inscription uppermost in accordance with its Management of Memorials Policy.

In order to maintain the solemnity of the burial ground the addition of items placed on any grave is restricted and, in all situations, must lie within the curtilage of the grave plot.

For guidance:

- Floral tributes placed on top of the grave following interment and backfilling can remain in situ for 14 days before being cleared.
- Except for those immediately following an interment no ornamentation whatsoever is allowed outside the curtilage of the plot which is a width of 36" for a burial plot and 30" for a cremated remains plot.
- Small ornaments/tributes are permitted for a period of three months after interment or earlier if their condition deteriorates or detracts from the visual aspect of the burial ground. Any items left on graves and cremation plots are at the owners' risk.
- Any additional ornamentation beyond that after interment e.g., vases/ornamentation must be made of non-breakable material firmly anchored i.e., either fixed onto/into the plinth or sunk firmly into the ground and be no more than 12" away from the front of the headstone.
- No unauthorised trees, shrubs or flowers may be planted within the burial ground or on graves. These and any planting which interferes with the maintenance of the burial ground will be removed.
- Fresh flowers/pot plants/artificial flowers should be in good condition and removed when dead or their condition has deteriorated.
- No personal fencing/edging/kerbing of any plot is allowed.
- Where kerbs are currently approved and fitted by a monumental stonemason all ornamentation must conform to these conditions and must sit within the curtilage of the kerbs.

All graves must be kept in a neat and tidy condition.

The Parish Council may remove any items from a grave plot, including those in existence before this review of the rules and regulations that are likely to cause risk, damage or offence to other visitors, any which have become worn and in poor condition and/or interfere with the maintenance of the burial ground.

#### Benches

No benches may be placed in the burial ground without prior consent of the Parish Council.

As part of consenting the design, materials and location of the bench will be agreed in advance.

- For guidance:
- Of sound wooden construction and 'park bench' in style matching other benches on the plinths.
  - Fixed to the ground
  - Benches are not permitted on the lawned areas
  - Any inscription to be agreed using similar guidance to that for memorials
  - Installation arranged by the undertaker.
  - There should be no additional adornment on or planting around the bench.
  - Anyone wishing to place a bench must contact the Parish Clerk

**Benches installed without permission or not in accordance with the permission granted will be removed.** In this event it will be removed to safe storage and disposed of after 12 months if it remains uncollected after that time.
