Spring has arrived and, at the time of writing, it is so lovely to see the daffodils we planted in full bloom around the village as well as the flowers around the mine wheel at the bottom of Mill Lane and the colourful crocuses which are in their first year of flower around the perimeter of the war memorial, they all look a picture. The spring flowers certainly brighten up the village after the long winter which coupled with the winter street cleaning, which took place in January, improves the appearance to the village. We have had many positive comments from residents saying how much cleaner the roads and pavements are looking after the removal of so many weeds and general debris. The challenge now is for the Parish Council to keep pressure on RMBC to ensure the village remains clean and tidy.

Looking back to Christmas, in addition to the Christmas trees on lampposts, we were all able to enjoy the splendid 'Festival of Christmas Trees' in the Memorial Garden. The trees looked wonderful and we had some excellent feedback from residents saying what joy they brought to the village over the festive period. The Parish Council would like to thank all those local businesses. individuals' who and generously sponsored the trees and I would like to extend my thanks also to the Councillors involved in the project for their hard work getting the trees in place and looking their best.

Many of you will have noticed that the new Beaumont Grange Development is nearing completion. I am pleased to advise that one of the last jobs before Jones Homes' leave the site will be to reorientate the Memorial to the Miners' so it acts once again as a 'Welcome to



Treeton'. We are hopeful that this will be achieved quickly and without any unnecessary delay! Further details are included inside.

I mentioned in the last Newsletter that the Parish Council is committed to addressing the growing problem of fly tipping and general littering which, quite frankly, is only getting worse. Over recent weeks we have reported an increased number of incidents of fly tipping in the village itself. Whilst RMBC has been helpful in removing most of this, it is unsightly and encourages some others to just add to it only compounding the problem. The amount of rubbish which has been dumped randomly is staggering and, as I have said before, is downright disgraceful. More details and examples of this can be found later in the Newsletter.

A number of residents in the village have raised concerns about parking and in particular parking on pavements restricting the passage of pedestrians, less able residents who use wheelchairs and parents with prams. Hot spots raised include the top of Well Lane, Rother Crescent, Arundel Avenue, Arundel Street by the Medical Centre and around the school. We respectfully ask that when parking vehicles residents do so considerately to ensure everyone's safety.

As some of you may be aware Julie James, our Parish Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer, will be retiring in May and we are currently in the process of appointing her successor. As a PC we have benefited greatly from Julie's considerable experience and knowledge as well as her tenacity for getting things done, ensuring projects come to fruition and from her sheer hard work. She has worked tirelessly on behalf of the village and its residents and she leaves the PC in a much stronger position as we move forward. We are enormously grateful to her for all she has achieved for the village during her tenure. The entire Parish Council would like to thank Julie for all her work and wish her a long and much deserved retirement.



CCTV in Treeton

The Parish Council is delighted to share that at an Extra Meeting of the Parish Council, held on 12th March 2024, it was agreed to proceed with the procurement and installation of CCTV cameras in the village.

You Spoke, We Listened

On 29th June last year the Parish Council held a Community Crime meeting in response to concerns raised by residents around car thefts and house break ins. At those meetings the message from residents was clear, that there were concerns over security and that further actions were needed.

The Parish Council heard this message loud and clear, and has since assisted with the launch of the local Neighbourhood Watch Scheme and increased partnership working with both SY Police and RMBC. The Parish Council is also committed to exploring all viable options which will improve safety and security within the village

Delivering on your Priorities

The decision taken at the Extra Parish Council Meeting will see 4 CCTV Cameras placed strategically across the village to act both as a deterrent and to assist South Yorkshire Police in any investigations.

The four locations for the cameras will ensure that the three entrances and exits to and from the village will have full coverage, in addition a fourth camera will be positioned in a more central location within the village.

The cameras will not be monitored 24/7, however, they will be continually recording, which will then allow South Yorkshire Police and RMBC to access the video recordings, in order to assist with investigations, if and when crimes are reported. It still remains paramount that all incidents are reported by residents, so that the cameras can be put to their intended use and to build a full picture of any criminal activities within the village.

The Cameras will be fully funded by Treeton Parish Council, from its reserves, and will be installed in partnership with RMBC. This project is further evidence of the Parish Council's continued commitment to listening to residents concerns and helping to ensure that residents feel more secure in their own homes and in the wider village.

Wood Lane Mine Wheel

In the introduction to this Newsletter, we advised that as the Beaumont Grange Development nears completion, one of the last steps Jones Homes will take is to reposition the Miners' Memorial, which includes the wheel, by reorientating it by 90 degrees and moving it closer to the road so it acts as a welcome when entering the village from Aughton.

You may recall that in the last edition of the Newsletter we informed residents that following protracted discussions between the Parish Council and Jones Homes' an 'agreement in principle' had been reached to relocate the Memorial to its new position. In reaching this agreement the Parish Council was of the view that it was the best outcome that could be achieved in terms of the Monument's visibility and its representation of Treeton's mining history.

At the time it was, however, recognised by both parties that that the relocation would require Jones Homes' to seek the necessary planning consent from RMBC as the agreed location of the Monument differed from the position shown on the original planning consent.

We can confirm that this planning application was submitted and the required consultation period ended on 22nd February. There were no objections to the application and the statutory requirement was that a decision on the application be communicated by 13th March, however, no decision had been published when this Newsletter went to print. The Parish Council has no reason to believe that this planning application will be rejected and we have confidence that the relocation of the Monument will go ahead once the planning consent is received.



Out of Control Dogs

The Parish Council has received a number of reports of out of control dogs over recent months, including instances of dog on dog attacks. There is also anecdotal evidence to suggest that the problem extends further than what is being reported to the Police and/or the Parish Council.

Below is some further information on what constitutes an out of control dog and how to report it:

Dogs out of control in public places

It's an offence to let a dog be dangerously out of control whether that's in public or private. A dog is considered to be out of control if it:

- injures someone
- makes someone worried that it might injure them

A court could also decide that your dog is dangerously out of control if:

- it attacks someone's animal
- the owner of an animal thinks they could be injured if they tried to stop your dog attacking their animal

Please note, a farmer is allowed to kill your dog if it's worrying their livestock.

If you see a dog loose, please report this online. If the dog seems to be out of control then call 101.

Banned dogs

In the UK, it's against the law to own certain types of dog, which are the Pit Bull Terrier, Japanese Tosa, Dogo Argentino, Fila Brasileiro & XL Bully.

It's also against the law to sell a banned dog, abandon a banned dog, give away a banned dog and breed from a banned dog.

Parking Problems

The Parish Council is often informed of parking problems across the village, including the blocking of pavements, parking near or on junctions and blocking the highway.

These issues should be reported either to RMBC, Land Owners or the Police, depending on the problem. If a vehicle is parked as follows, it should be reported direct to South Yorkshire Police:

- on zig zag lines
- dangerously
- in a way that would prevent emergency vehicles from accessing

Vehicles parked as below should be reported to RMBC:

- over a dropped kerb
- on a pedestrian crossing (including the area marked by the zig-zag lines)
- in spaces reserved for Blue Badge holders, residents or motorbikes (unless entitled to do so)
- in marked taxi bays, cycle lanes or red lines
- near a school entrance, bus or tram stop

It is important that these matters are reported so that patterns can be seen, preventative measures put in place and where necessary enforcement carried out.

Full details of what should be reported and who to report it to can be found using the QR Codes below.

Please also feel free to let the Parish Council know when you have made a report, either through our Facebook Page or by emailing the Clerk. The Parish Council will then be able to follow up with the appropriate bodies on residents behalf to try and ensure that action is taken.

The War on Litter

Treeton is continuing to see an ever increasing incidence of fly tipping by a small minority which sadly impacts the majority of people who genuinely care about the appearance of the village and the environment in which we live.

Below are just a few examples of the offending recently witnessed by the Parish Council:

- The remains of a firework display on Hilly Fields. If the fireworks can be carried to the site where they were ignited then why cannot the residue be taken home?
- Carpets, kitchen tiles and four tyres dumped by Treeton Dyke by someone who obviously has vehicle access. Treeton Dyke and its surroundings is an area of outstanding beauty and there for us all to enjoy. All of these items are still in situ because heavy sodden carpets are difficult for volunteers to remove. These dumped items have created an absolute eye sore.
- Stinking rotten fish and chicken together with other rubbish thrown from Washfield Lane onto the Cowfield Bank which then had to be collected up manually and bagged. Very unpleasant!



- A Christmas tree stump contained in a plastic bucket full of concrete thrown from Washfield Lane down the bank into the Cowfield.
- Bags full of rubbish dumped on the land at the bottom of Twenty lands which was then bagged up by a resident and placed by the waste bin and reported to RMBC as fly tipping.



- Rubbish fly tipped at the rear of Nichols shop, off Station Road, and more recently builders' rubble just dumped in the middle of the area for all to see.
- Bag(s) of rubbish left at the rear of Wood Lane by the garages.
- Bags of rubbish left by a bin on High Hazel found to hold the contents of a resident's kitchen cupboard cleanout. Please be aware that this constitutes fly tipping and RMBC will only remove waste from the side of a bin if it is litter collected by our litter pickers and officially labelled as such.

Why do a few people think it is acceptable to abuse and deface our village in this way?

None of this is rubbish which has been thrown from car windows, it has been consciously dumped by people too lazy to go to the tip or have it disposed of legally.

There is no immediate solution to this problem but the Parish Council is currently exploring ideas about how to tackle this problem which includes, in conjunction with RMBC, the deployment of mobile concealed CCTV cameras around the village as a means of identifying offenders.

We are very fortunate here in Treeton to have a group of litter pickers who routinely give of their time picking up the litter of people who feel it is acceptable to discard their rubbish at random even where there is a waste bin in sight! We are extremely grateful to all of these kind people but we have to acknowledge that there are limits to the rubbish they can recover which includes dealing with the impact of selfish and lazy fly tippers.

Treeton Nature Diary

Swifts

For many years one of the great sights and sounds of summer, were the many Swifts over Treeton. In recent years, home improvements, particularly, the installation of new UPVC soffits, fascias and barge boards have excluded many Swifts from their former breeding holes.

These fascinating long-living birds, spend almost their whole lives on the wing going years usually without landing, commuting between Europe and Southern Africa. There are now no more than a handful of pairs still nesting in the village.

If any villagers that still have swifts are considering installing new roofing features there are ways to keep Swifts by getting the installers to make holes in the soffits as illustrated in the photos.

It has been proved that Swifts rarely use boxes/bricks fitted retrospectively. The installation of boxes and special bricks can work, but usually when used with a speaker system with the Swifts calls. For further advice please visit the excellent Sheffield Swift Network website:

Butterflies

The many former tips of Treeton for many years attracted an increasing and diverse range of butterflies, particularly in the early days of colonisation of grasses and plants. Butterflies need their host plants for the caterpillars to feed on, as well as a range of flowers to obtain nectar from.

Since the natural restoration of many of the tips, the following grassland butterflies have become established Orange Tip, Dingy Skipper, Small Skipper, Large Skipper Essex skipper, Ringlet, Gatekeeper, Meadow Brown, Wall Brown, Small Heath, Common Blue, Brown Argus.

Many other species also occur, but the aforementioned species are particularly attracted to grasslands, with many of their caterpillars feeding on grasses.

The main threat to these species is the loss of grasslands to woodland/scrub and the carpeting of the grasses with alien plants such as Michaelmas Daisies. Wall Brown once very common, has rarely been seen in the last 20 years and Dingy Skipper has becoming very hard to find in recent years.

Occasionally during long hot summers Clouded Yellow butterflies from Southern Europe/North Africa migrate further north than usual and are invariably found on the local tips. LINDA STRINGER EXD UK

News in Brief

Since the start of the New Year, the Parish Council has been busy working on behalf of residents on a number of projects and pieces of case work, including:

- Engaging RMBC with flood management for residents at Shorland/Windle Court following a large number of flooding incidents at residents properties over the last 3-5 months.
- Flood management on Treeton Lane to Aughton Lobbying RMBC resulting in the removal of the earth bund in the layby and work on the drainage system to reduce the flooding of the road.
- Flood resilience & emergency planning with RMBC to raise the profile of the experiences of residents and the village
- Engaging with RMBC to deliver enhanced street cleaning across Treeton through January.
- Focus on potholes & blocked drains including regularly reporting inclidents to ensure RMBC address them properly.
- Engaging with RMBC and SYMCA resulting in the installation of lights in the Bole Hill Bus Stop.

There are also a number of projects and pieces of case work that the Parish Council is continuing to work on, including:

- Parking issues throughout the village, including the blocking of driveways and pavements, and illegal parking near to and opposite junctions.
- Ongoing monitoring and reporting of potholes on both pavements and roads, and following up on reports by residents, where the PC has been made aware.
- Ongoing monitoring and reporting of litter and fly tipping problems.

NEW BOOKING SYSTEM

The surgery is looking at a new way of working by using a clinical triage system. Hopefully this will take the pressure off the 8am rush to get an appointment and help ensure that patients needs are prioritised and dealt with accordingly. On calling the surgery you will be placed on a triage list and assessed by a clinician. You will then either be:

- Asked to book a routine appointment.
- Signposted to an appropriate service.
- Seen/Spoken to by a clinician.

Please Note: this is a new system so please be patient and kind to our staff.

<u>NHS 111 Online symptom checker</u> – unsure who the most appropriate service is for your problem? Check the NHS 111 online symptom checker, answer a few questions and they will advise whether you need to see a GP, A&E, Pharmacy etc.

Our practice Website & NHS choices offer self-help advice.

SMEAR APPOINTMENTS - available to book online (nurse clinic)- only book if you have received an invite from the surgery or from cervical screening. If you are not due for a smear this will be discarded by the laboratory.

Telephone and Face to Face appointments – If you have a face to face appointment please arrive in time for your appointment. If you arrive late the clinician has the right to mark you as a DNA and ask you to rebook. For Telephone consultations please ensure you are available within 30mins before and after your appointment time as we cannot guarantee you will be contacted at exactly this time due to delays. We have had to remove online booking for GP's and ANP's due to inappropriate bookings which then leads to wasted appointments.

ADVANCE NURSE PRACTITIONER – Our ANP can deal with headaches, chest infections, sore throat, sinusitis, diarrhoea, abdominal pain, heartburn, sickness, uti, thrush, gout, new neck or back problems, acne, eczema, rashes, warts, verrucae, impetigo, bites, in growing toenails, allergic reactions, hay fever, asthma attacks, medication reviews. Not appropriate for pregnant ladies or Mental Health issues.

Did Not Attend (DNA's)

Whilst we understand things crop up which may mean you cannot attend your appointment, we would appreciate it if you could call to cancel your appointment with as much notice as possible so we can offer it to someone else who may need it.

Telephone Appointments

When booking a telephone appointment we cannot guarantee a set time, we are trying to advise patients it will be a morning or afternoon telephone call, however if you have access to online booking this will show as a set time – this is for surgery use only so please keep your phone handy!

Annual Reviews – i.e Asthma, Diabetic, Medication

We are changing the way we call people for their annual reviews. You will now be called in your birthday Month, but it may mean you get 2 reviews in the 1st year. These reviews are an important way of monitoring our patient's health and ensuring the correct care and advice is given. **Please ensure you book your appointment when you are invited.**

Rotherham Health App

Did you know you can use Rotherham Health App to send us non urgent messages, contact details updates, extend sick note request, prescription queries, referral follow-up requests using the forms section in the app.

SystmOne Online

You can now send the admin team online messages, these should only be nonurgent queries e.g. sick note request, general advise, referral follow up etc.

Please Note: we do not accept prescription requests over the telephone unless you are housebound or have been given permission by the GP due to medical reasons. All requests should be made via the Rotherham Health App or if you are not able to do it this way pop your requests in our letterbox located on the right of our entrance. We require 48 hours notice to process your request.
